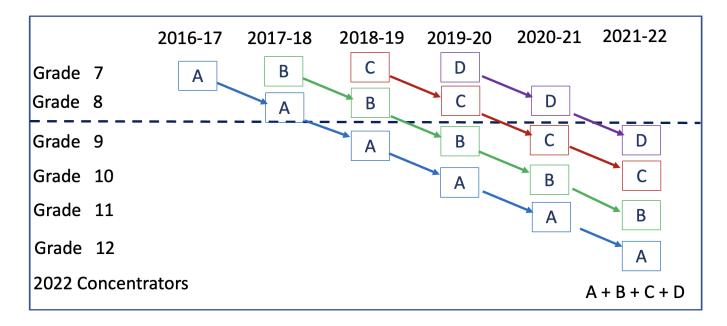

**Non-Concentrator** -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

### Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 – 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2020-21 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more program of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2021 concentrators is provided below.



#### **Data Definitions:**

- The performance measure data in this report are from the 2021-22 school year except for postsecondary placement which is a lagged indicator. The students included in the postsecondary placement performance measure exited high school in the 2020-21 school year.




### CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE









#### CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE BY CLUSTER





### CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE BY CLUSTER








#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS


### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS

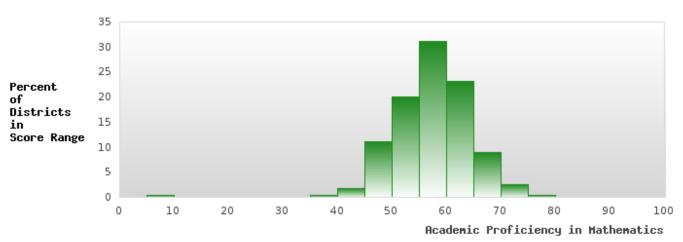




### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY RACE/ETHNICITY






#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY CLUSTER


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY CLUSTER








### SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS























#### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT POSTSECONDARY PLACEMENT PERCENT



















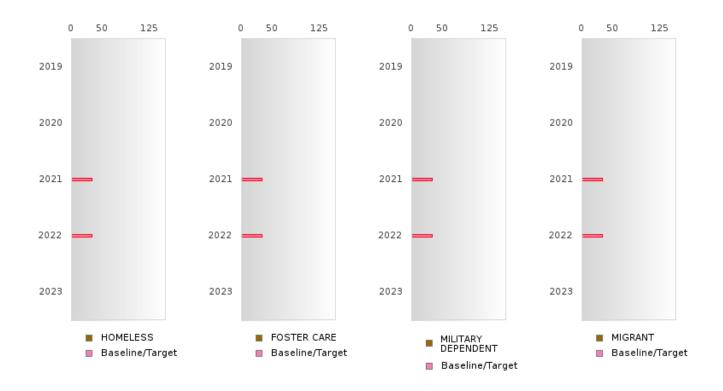


