Any two levels must sum to two (2) credits within a program of study. Concentrators must have 1.0 credit in Level 1. Level 1 includes the foundational courses. Levels progress in specificity as required (Section 3(41)(D-E)).

Non-Concentrator -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 - 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2022-23 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more programs of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2023 concentrators is provided below.

GRADUATION PERFORMANCE MEASURES [1S1, 1S2]

CORNING SCHOOL DISTRICT

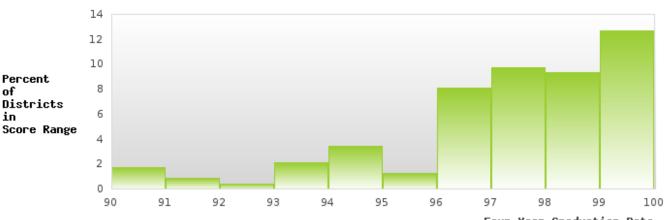



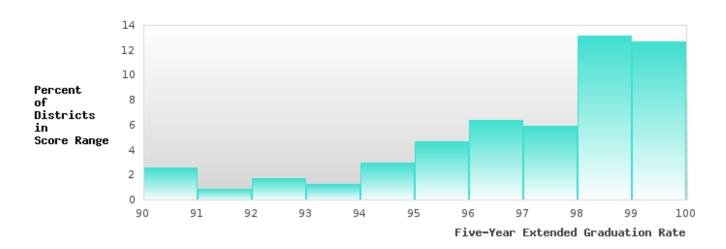



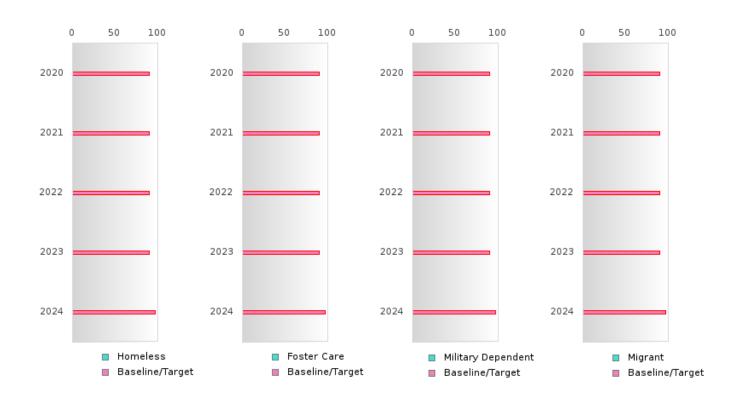

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE MEASURES [2S1, 2S2, 2S3]

The Academic Proficiency Performance Measures (Reading/Language Arts [1S1]; Mathematics [1S2]; Science [1S3]) in Arkansas's approved Perkins V plan are designed to align with the achievement and growth measures in Arkansas's approved ESSA plan. This alignment provides schools with a unified focus on increased rigor and relevance in student learning opportunities within a student-focused learning system to improve academic proficiency and increase students' readiness for college, career, and community engagement.

The Academic Performance Measures include concentrators that are full academic year students: students who are continuously enrolled in a particular school on or before October 1 through the date of the first data pull for the regular or alternate assessment.

Assessments Included: Act Aspire (Grades 9 - 10) • Dynamic Learning Maps (Grades 9 - 10) • ACT (Grades 11 -12 [3-yr best])



ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS













DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE





ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY







SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS











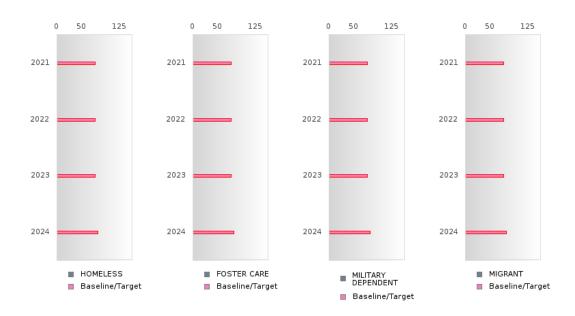

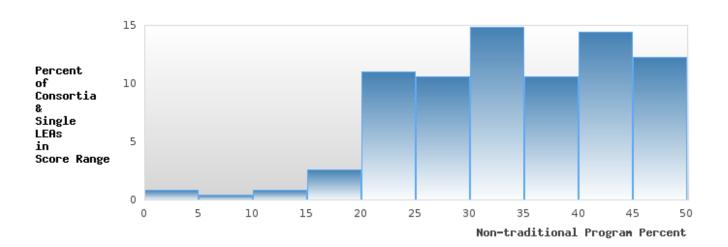

Percent of Concentrators Earning a Concentration in a Program of Study Leading to a Nontraditional Field








PERCENT OF GRADUATED CONCENTRATORS EARNING A RECONGIZED POSTSECONDARY CREDENTIAL


Percent of Graduated Concentrators Earning a Recognized Postsecondary Credential 🛛 Baseline/Target








