
**CTE Concentrator** -A student who has completed one foundational CTE credit and one additional CTE credit for a total of two CTE credits within the same approved CTE program of study.

Any two levels must sum to two (2) credits within a program of study. Concentrators must have 1.0 credit in Level 1. Level 1 includes the foundational courses. Levels progress in specificity as required (Section 3(41)(D-E)).

**Non-Concentrator** -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

#### Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 – 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2022-23 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more programs of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2023 concentrators is provided below.



#### **Data Definitions:**

- The performance measure data in this report are from the 2023-24 school year except for postsecondary placement which is a lagged indicator. The students included in the postsecondary placement performance measure exited high school in the 2022-23 school year.




### DISTRIBUTION OF CONSORTIA AND SINGLE LEA FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATES

















### DISTRIBUTION OF CONSORTIA AND SINGLE LEA SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE



#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY



#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY RACE/ETHNICITY






### SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS


#### SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR SCIENCE




























## DISTRIBUTION OF CONSORTIA AND SINGLE LEA RECOGNIZED POSTSECONDARY CREDENTIAL PERCENT
