

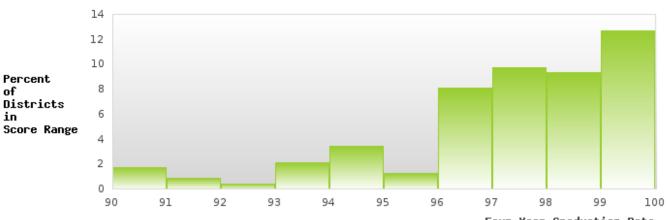



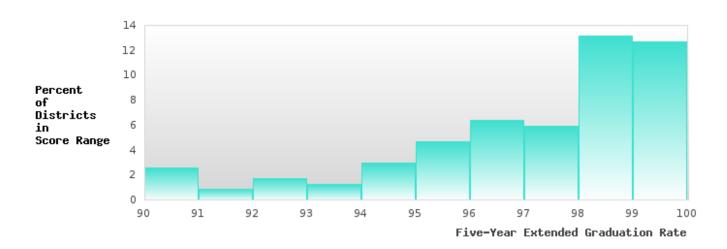







The Academic Proficiency Performance Measures (Reading/Language Arts [1S1]; Mathematics [1S2]; Science [1S3]) in Arkansas's approved Perkins V plan are designed to align with the achievement and growth measures in Arkansas's approved ESSA plan. This alignment provides schools with a unified focus on increased rigor and relevance in student learning opportunities within a student-focused learning system to improve academic proficiency and increase students' readiness for college, career, and community engagement.

The Academic Performance Measures include concentrators that are full academic year students: students who are continuously enrolled in a particular school on or before October 1 through the date of the first data pull for the regular or alternate assessment.



ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS



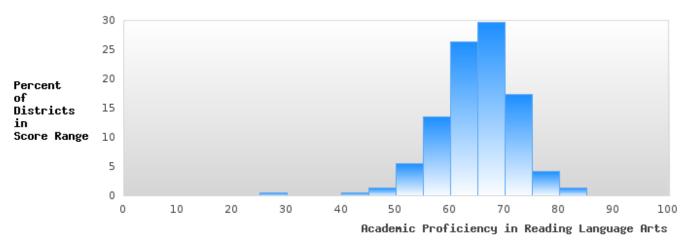


Academic Proficiency in Reading Language Arts Baseline/Target

ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS

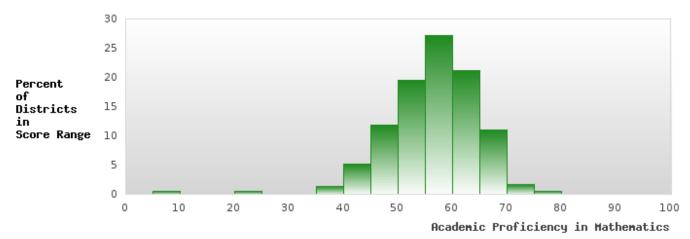



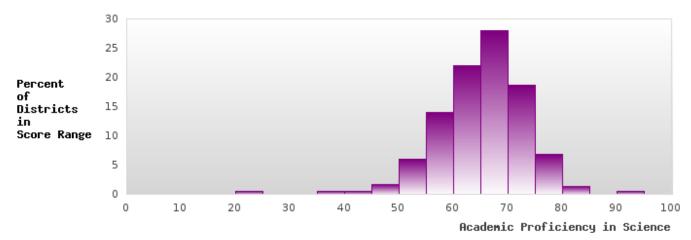



DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE





ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY















SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR READING LANGUAGE ARTS





SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS




























Percent Of Concentrators Having Placement After 2 Leaving Secondary Education Baseline/Target







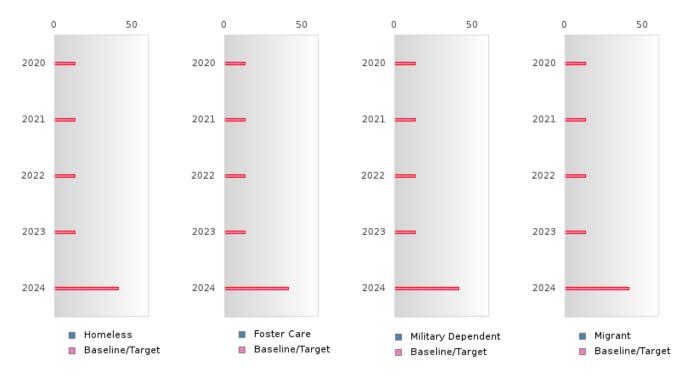






Percent of Graduated Concentrators Earning a Recognized Postsecondary Credential 🛛 Baseline/Target








