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### **DEFINITIONS:**

#### CROSSETT SCHOOL DISTRICT

**CTE Concentrator** -A student who has completed one foundational CTE credit and one additional CTE credit for a total of two CTE credits within the same approved CTE program of study.

Any two levels must sum to two (2) credits within a program of study. Concentrators must have 1.0 credit in Level 1. Level 1 includes the foundational courses. Levels progress in specificity as required (Section 3(41)(D-E)).

**Non-Concentrator** -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

### Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 – 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2022-23 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more programs of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2023 concentrators is provided below.



### **Data Definitions:**

- The performance measure data in this report are from the 2023-24 school year except for postsecondary placement which is a lagged indicator. The students included in the postsecondary placement performance measure exited high school in the 2022-23 school year.
- Consortium membership and single LEA status are based on the 2023-24 school year.
- Students are included in the consortium, district, and school aggregations based on their district and school LEAs indicated in 2023-24 SIS cycle 7 and based on consortium membership and single LEA status for 2023-24.

### **CROSSETT SCHOOL DISTRICT**

Performance Measures for Graduation Rate consist of a Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (1S1) and a Five-Year Extended Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (1S2). In both cases, only concentrators are included in the measure and concentrators are only counted once.

### Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate [1S1]

- Numerator: The percentage of CTE concentrators who graduate high school, as measured by the four-year adjusted cohort graduation rate (defined in section 8101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965).
- Denominator: Number of CTE concentrators who, in the reporting year, were included in the State's computation of its graduation rate as defined in the State's Consolidated Accountability Plan pursuant to Section 1111(b)(2) of the ESSA.

- Denominator: Number of CTE concentrators who, in the reporting year, were included in the State's computation of its extended-year cohort graduation rate as defined in the State's Consolidated Accountability Plan pursuant to Section 1111(b)(2) of the ESEA.




#### CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE









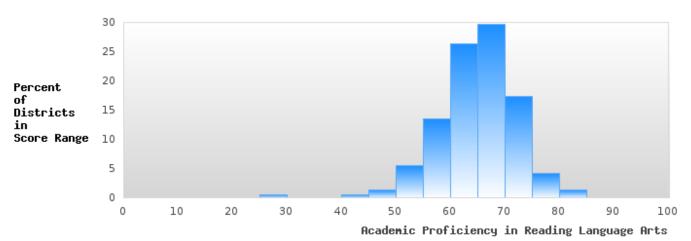
#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS


### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS




### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN MATHEMATICS




### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY RACE/ETHNICITY






#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY CLUSTER


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY CLUSTER


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY CLUSTER








## SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS



































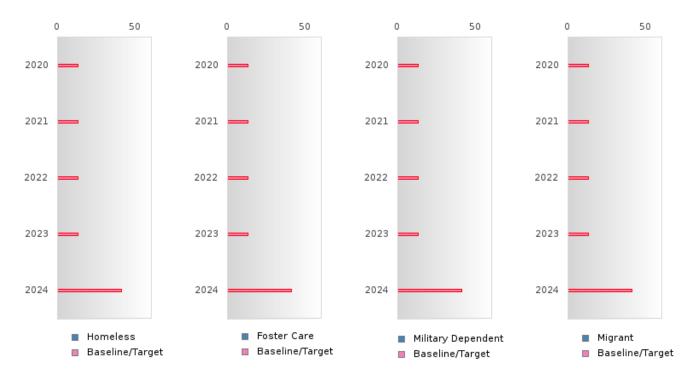





### PERCENT OF GRADUATED CONCENTRATORS EARNING A RECONGIZED POSTSECONDARY CREDENTIAL












