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DEFINITIONS:

BENTONVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT

CTE Concentrator -A student who has completed one foundational CTE credit and one additional CTE credit for a total of two CTE credits within the same approved CTE program of study.

Any two levels must sum to two (2) credits within a program of study. Concentrators must have 1.0 credit in Level 1. Level 1 includes the foundational courses. Levels progress in specificity as required (Section 3(41)(D-E)).

Non-Concentrator -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 – 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2022-23 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more programs of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2023 concentrators is provided below.



Data Definitions:

- The performance measure data in this report are from the 2023-24 school year except for postsecondary placement which is a lagged indicator. The students included in the postsecondary placement performance measure exited high school in the 2022-23 school year.
- Consortium membership and single LEA status are based on the 2023-24 school year.
- Students are included in the consortium, district, and school aggregations based on their district and school LEAs indicated in 2023-24 SIS cycle 7 and based on consortium membership and single LEA status for 2023-24.



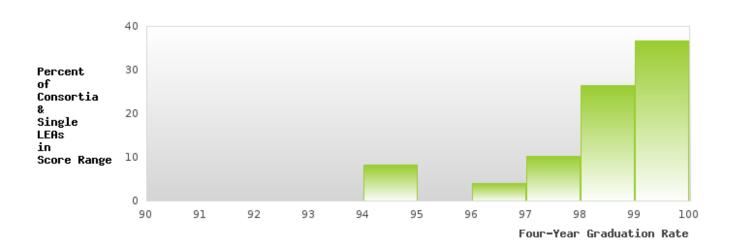
CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE



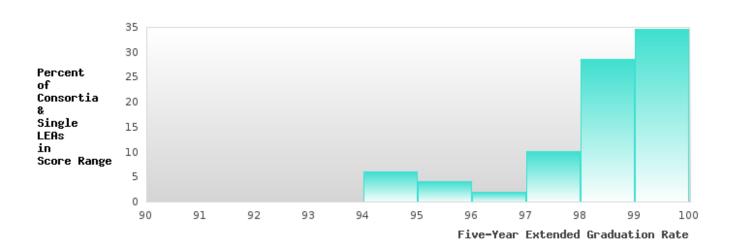





CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE BY SPECIAL POPULATION





CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE BY CLUSTER





CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE BY CLUSTER





ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE MEASURES [2S1, 2S2, 2S3]

BENTONVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Academic Proficiency Performance Measures (Reading/Language Arts [1S1]; Mathematics [1S2]; Science [1S3]) in Arkansas's approved Perkins V plan are designed to align with the achievement and growth measures in Arkansas's approved ESSA plan. This alignment provides schools with a unified focus on increased rigor and relevance in student learning opportunities within a student-focused learning system to improve academic proficiency and increase students' readiness for college, career, and community engagement.

The Academic Performance Measures include concentrators that are full academic year students: students who are continuously enrolled in a particular school on or before October 1 through the date of the first data pull for the regular or alternate assessment.

*Points for Exceeding depend on the number of students in the lowest readiness level compared to the number in the Exceeding level.












DISTRIBUTION OF CONSORTIA AND SINGLE LEA SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY RACE/ETHNICITY




ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY SPECIAL POPULATION


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY SPECIAL POPULATION


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN SCIENCE BY SPECIAL POPULATION




ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY CLUSTER


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY CLUSTER


ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY CLUSTER





SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR READING LANGUAGE ARTS




SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS

















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



















PERCENT OF GRADUATED CONCENTRATORS EARNING A RECONGIZED POSTSECONDARY CREDENTIAL














