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# **DEFINITIONS:**

#### MOUNT IDA SCHOOL DISTRICT

**CTE Concentrator** -A student who has completed one foundational CTE credit and one additional CTE credit for a total of two CTE credits within the same approved CTE program of study.

Any two levels must sum to two (2) credits within a program of study. Concentrators must have 1.0 credit in Level 1. Level 1 includes the foundational courses. Levels progress in specificity as required (Section 3(41)(D-E)).

**Non-Concentrator** -All other students. Non-concentrators may include students who have completed one or more CTE credits that were not within the same program of study or in the progressive levels of specificity. Non-concentrators may include students who have never completed a CTE credit.

## Who is included in these reports?

Students included in these reports are Grades 9 – 12 students actively enrolled as indicated in 2022-23 school year SIS Cycle 7 who have earned a concentration in one or more programs of study. Credits may be earned starting in Grade 7 through Grade 12. An example for 2023 concentrators is provided below.



### **Data Definitions:**

- The performance measure data in this report are from the 2023-24 school year except for postsecondary placement which is a lagged indicator. The students included in the postsecondary placement performance measure exited high school in the 2022-23 school year.
- Consortium membership and single LEA status are based on the 2023-24 school year.
- Students are included in the consortium, district, and school aggregations based on their district and school LEAs indicated in 2023-24 SIS cycle 7 and based on consortium membership and single LEA status for 2023-24.

### MOUNT IDA SCHOOL DISTRICT

Performance Measures for Graduation Rate consist of a Four-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (1S1) and a Five-Year Extended Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (1S2). In both cases, only concentrators are included in the measure and concentrators are only counted once.




### CONSORTIUM FOUR-YEAR ADJUSTED COHORT GRADUATION RATE







# ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE MEASURES [2S1, 2S2, 2S3]

### MOUNT IDA SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Academic Proficiency Performance Measures (Reading/Language Arts [1S1]; Mathematics [1S2]; Science [1S3]) in Arkansas's approved Perkins V plan are designed to align with the achievement and growth measures in Arkansas's approved ESSA plan. This alignment provides schools with a unified focus on increased rigor and relevance in student learning opportunities within a student-focused learning system to improve academic proficiency and increase students' readiness for college, career, and community engagement.

The Academic Performance Measures include concentrators that are full academic year students: students who are continuously enrolled in a particular school on or before October 1 through the date of the first data pull for the regular or alternate assessment.






# DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS






### DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT SCORES FOR ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY IN SCIENCE


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN READING LANGUAGE ARTS BY RACE/ETHNICITY


#### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY RACE/ETHNICITY






### ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY SCORE IN MATHEMATICS BY SPECIAL POPULATION






### SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR MATHEMATICS






#### SCATTERPLOT OF WEIGHTED ACHIEVEMENT & VALUE-ADDED GROWTH FOR SCIENCE



































### PERCENT OF GRADUATED CONCENTRATORS EARNING A RECONGIZED POSTSECONDARY CREDENTIAL














